Cross Country Begins Workouts Aug. 23

The Texas A&M-Kingsville men's and women's cross country teams will have 17 returnees from last year's cross country and track and field squads when they report for the start of preseason workouts Aug. 23.

Ryan Dall, starting his third season as head coach of the squad, has one senior, four juniors and 11 sophomores with experience.

The returnees are Brett Arredondo, sophomore from Kingsville (King); Amanuel Belay,

Volleyball Opens Drills Monday

The Texas A&M-Kingsville volleyball team reports Sunday and will begin its preseason workouts Tuesday in the Steinke Physical Education Center.

The players will undergo testing Sunday and Monday and will hit the floor for the first time at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday. A second workout is set for 3:30 p.m.

The same schedule will continue through Aug. 21.

Four of the 15 players expected to report at returning letterwinners.

Shannon Alvarado, in her fourth season as head of the Javelina program, will have Jordan Wills returning as an assistant for the fourth year.

Two of the returnees have three letters: Casey Chancellor, 5-10 right side from Bellville, and Virginia Hernandez, 5-6 libero from Katy.

Amanda Waclawczyk, 6-1 junior middle blocker from Poth, has two letters and Ali Insell, 5-7 sophomore defensive specialist from Houston (The Woodlands), lettered last year as a freshman.

Transfers with collegiate experience are Sondra Cui, 5-6 junior setter from San Antonio (Steele) and St. Mary's; Laura Macek, 6-0 junior middle blocker from Ellsworth, Kan., and Barton County (Kan.) Community College, and Whitney Roth, 6-1 junior middle blocker from Gering, Neb., and Western Nebraska Community College.

Four returning squadmen are Cady Mercer, 5-8 sophomore utility from Katy; Jess Morris, 5-8 senior outside hitter from Goliad; Cristina Romo, 5-10 sophomore middle blocker from Bandera

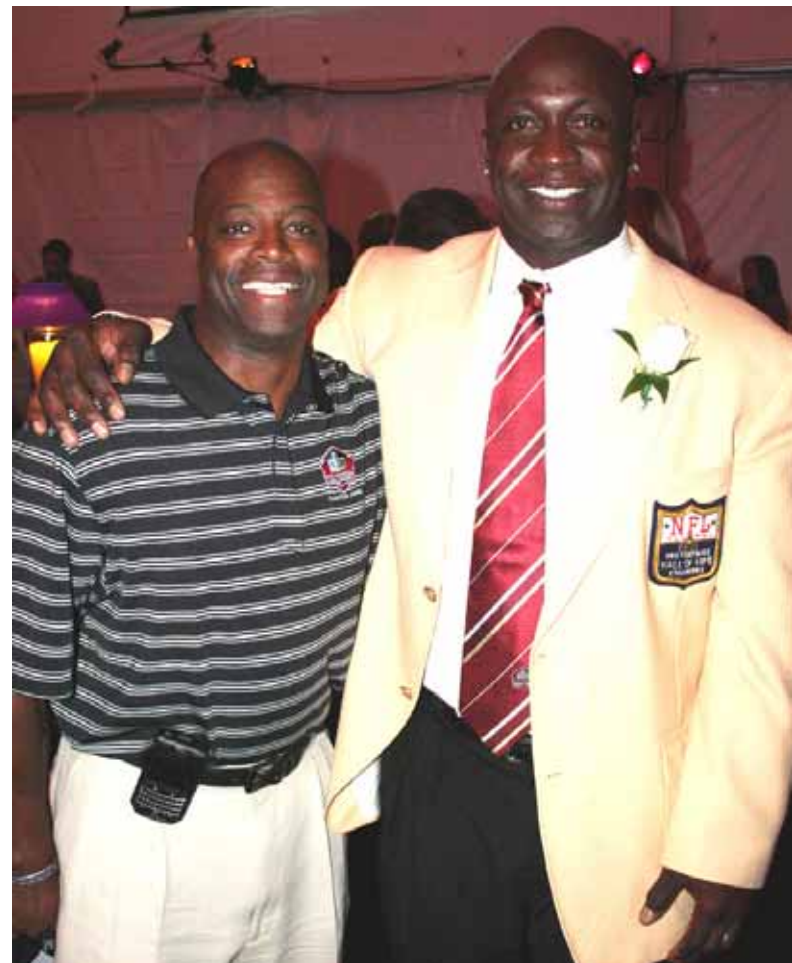
(Medina Valley), and Amanda Yeager, 5-7 senior setter from Brenham.

Brittany Von Ruff, 5-8 setter from Pearland, was a freshman redshirt last fall.

Incoming freshmen will be Bethany Friesenhahn, 6-1 middle

blocker from Poth; Lauryn Lozano, 5-10 setter from San Antonio (Smithson Valley), and Nina Taufa'ausa Vincent, 5-10 outside hitter from Hayward, Calif.

THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF the Javelina football program never cease to amaze. Even for someone who has been around it for 42 years.

It not only has achieved far more than what any other college division program but has kept company with the big boys of the top 20 or 30 in college football.

Another example of this came last weekend at the Pro Football Hall of Fame enshrinement ceremony in Canton, Ohio.

On stage with the big'uns was a Javelina.

John Randle became the third Javelina to be inducted into the Hall and the second in the past three years.

It's doubtful that any other school has had as many as two inducted within a three-year period.

John represented the Javelina athletic program well.

The highlight film of John trash-talking with the opponent ball players was the best of all the highlight presentations, and brought the biggest reaction from the crowd of more than 50,000 in the stadium.

And his trash-talking isn't nasty. It's funny. And it did get inside the opponents' heads.

John is just another in an extremely long line of Javelinas who have made the football program one of the best in collegiate football.

NOTES FROM CANTON:

.....When John Saunders of ESPN introduced John at the banquet where the inductees were presented their gold jackets, he mistakenly said Randle was from Texas A&M.

But the next time he referred to John's alma mater, he correctly stated Texas A&I.

It was disappointing that when John and the other members of the 2010 class were on stage and greeting the returning Hall of Fame members, Saunders didn't recognize when he introduced Darrell Green that he was from the same college division school in deep South Texas as John.

.....Three of John's coaches at Texas A&I were in Canton. Head coach Ron Harms, defensive coordinator Richard Cundiff and defensive coach Keith Walters attended the activities during the weekend.

.....An impressive delegation of former Javelina athletes were in Ohio, many with their families.

I'll probably leave some out but they included Kevin Beasley, Phil Esquivel, Tony Garza, Green, Sheldon Haliburton, Ed LaTouf, Adam Pena, David Rider, Jorge Rodriguez, Rodney Serpa and Dick Watson.

.....Harms attended the ceremonies along with his son, Joe, a former Javelina coach; daughter Beth Plater and her husband Bryan; son-in-law Brian Wheelless, and two of his grandchildren.

.....Representatives from the current Javelina athletic staff in Canton were Ken Oliver, director of athletics; Ruben Cantu, associate athletic director and athletic trainer; Shane Meling, Javelina sports information director, and yours truly.

.....Over and over during the weekend events, the 2010 induction class was called the best ever. And how appropriate that it included a Javelina.

.....When they gave out information on Emmitt Smith, they again made some mistakes.

It was stated that he is the only college player to make "legitimate" All-America first teams three consecutive seasons during his career.

Enter Javelina Johnny Bailey.

Johnny was on 14 All-America first teams in his four seasons as a Javelina, and that included the very legit Little All-America first unit four times.

He was the NCAA Division II player of the year three times and is the only college division player to ever make the Football Writers of America All-America team. That squad is usually reserved for Division I players.

Johnny Bailey is the most honored college football player ever, any division.

.....An obvious question now becomes who will become the fourth Javelina to be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

Who and when it happens is anybody's guess. He might well be one of the Javelinas reporting for preseason drills this week.

But with the history of Javelina football, it seems evident that it will happen.

.....Another Javelina present in Canton last weekend, but not able to attend the Hall of Fame events, was Jimmy Saddler-McQueen.

Jimmy was signed as a free agent by the Dallas Cowboys and was in town with the team to play in the Hall of Fame game Sunday night.

Saddler-McQueen got his name mentioned on national television several times.

Jimmy was a linebacker with the Javelinas the past four years.

.....A very impressive showing came by the Pittsburgh Steelers when the entire team and coaching staff showed up for the enshrinement ceremony as a tribute to their defensive coordinator Dick LeBeau, one of the seven inductees.

Whether a Steeler fan or not, you had to be impressed with that effort, coming during the preseason workout period.

.....The largest group of fans attending the enshrinement ceremony were those supporting the Dallas Cowboys.

They roared at every mention of any Cowboy name or team, and especially when Emmitt Smith was on stage.

But they also were impressed with former Javelina defensive back Darrell Green when he was interviewed during one of the commercial breaks at the ceremony.

Darrell talked about Emmitt and their teams' rivalry, Darrell with the Washington Redskins and Emmitt with the Cowboys.

Green was very complimentary of Emmitt and the respect he had for the Cowboy star. The fans cheered Green throughout the interview.

TV fans didn't get to see the interview. It was done in the stadium when ESPN ran commercials between the individual inductions.

.....It was good to have Darrell in Canton to see his fellow Javelina inducted.

At first he wasn't sure he could make it.

Darrell has been in South Korea and the Philippines recently doing work for his church.

But he made it and added much to the ceremonies and to the honoring of John.

.....The Canton-Akron area was the center of the sports world last weekend.

Canton had most of the all-time greats of the NFL, past and present, in town for the Hall of Fame.

Akron, 20 miles north of Canton, had Tiger Woods competing in a golf tournament.

And LeBron James returned to his hometown, Akron, for a bike-a-thon.

Trying to get a room or a car rental in the area was impossible. The car rentals at the Cleveland airport were sold out as early as Thursday.

.....Former Cowboy Michael Irvin was in Canton as a Hall of Fame member and was on crutches. He tore an achilles muscle recently while, as Irvin put it, "messing around".

My wife and I flew back to South Texas Sunday morning on a 54-passenger plane from Cleveland to Dallas and one of those on the flight was Irvin.

As a reporter, it was tempting not to ask him why he wasn't staying to see the Cowboys play on Sunday night, but I respected his privacy.

THE CHENNAULT CUP will again be up for grabs when Texas A&M-Kingsville opens its home season Sept. 18 with Texas A&M-Commerce in Javelina Stadium.

The Cup was initiated in 1990 when the Lions faced West Alabama.

After two seasons, the series was stopped and the Javelinas agreed to become a part of the annual Cup matchup.

The Javelinas and Lions played for the Cup each year until 2004 when the Lone Star Conference schedule didn't have the schools meeting on the gridiron.

The series was resumed last fall and the Cup became the prize once again.

The Javelinas won the first seven games in the series and have taken 11 of the 13 Cup games.

The Cup honors Commerce native Lt. Gen. Claire Chennault. It is sponsored by the Lions Club International of Commerce and was initiated the year of Chennault's 100th birthday.

Chennault was noted for forming the Flying Tigers fighter squadron in the 1930s and was commander of the 214th Air Force during World War II.

Football No. 16 in AFCA Poll

The Texas A&M-Kingsville football team is ranked No. 16 in the NCAA Division II preseason poll selected by the American Football Coaches Association.

The Javelinas were one of four Lone Star Conference schools, all in the South Division, ranked in the top 25 and four others received votes.

Northwest Missouri was easily the top team with 22 first-place votes and 645 points. Grand Valley (Mich.) was second with three first-place votes and 621 points.

The Javelinas open with Northwest Missouri Sept. 2 in Maryville, Mo.

Other LSC teams in the poll are Abilene Christian No. 7, West Texas A&M No. 11 and Midwestern State No. 19.
