## ABOUT TEXAS A&M-KINGSVILLE



Texas A&M University-Kingsville is South Texas' premiere university, offering more academic programs and degrees, providing better learning and living facilities, doing more research and producing more successful graduates than any other college or university in the region.

- » Texas A&M University-Kingsville placed 37th in the nation in bachelor's degrees awarded to Hispanics in a poll of the Top Degree Producers for 2007 by the magazine *Diverse: Issues in Higher Education*.
- » The American Society for Engineering Education (ASEE) ranks Texas A&M University-Kingsville ninth in the nation in number of engineering bachelor's degrees awarded to Hispanic students.
- » Texas A&M-Kingsville is the only university south of San Antonio listed as a doctoral/research university in the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education.
- » We have nationally recognized programs in wildlife sciences, biology (natural toxins research), engineering and music.
- » Our campus has several well-respected research entities, including the Caesar Kleberg Wildlife Research Institute, the Natural Toxins Research Center, the Center for Research Excellence in Science and Technology-Research on Environmental Sustainability of Semi-Arid Coastal Areas and the South Texas Environmental Institute.
- » The College Board, a non-profit association, named a two-part A&M-Kingsville physics course among the top physics courses in the nation.
- » The university offers a biomedical sciences bachelor's degree, joining only four other universities in offering this program that prepares students for graduate study and careers in the medical field.
- » The university offers the only master's program in ranch management in the world.
