## **Texas A&M-Kingsville Closes Curtain On Season At Angelo State**

The 2006 season will come to an end Saturday as the Javelinas travel to San Angelo to take on the Angelo State Rams. Game time is set for 2:00 p.m. at San Angelo Stadium.

## **Javelinas And Rams Meet For 40<sup>th</sup> Time**

The Javelinas lead the all-time series 27-12 and have won four of the last five games, with the Rams winning last year's wild overtime affair in Kingsville, 54-51.

The game has been the regular season finale for both teams every year since 1986 and the two teams have met every year since 1968.

## **Final Game For Cundiff As Javelina Head Man**

Not since 1984 has there been a Javelina football game where Richard Cundiff hasn't been on the sideline. That streak of 256 games will come to an end Saturday in San Angelo as Cundiff will step down at the end of the season.

The Javelinas are 184-72 during Cundiff's 22 years on staff. He has been head coach since 2000, posting a 52-27 record.

## **Javelinas One-Two Rushing Punch**

Houston natives and junior running backs **Raymorris Miller (Alief Elsik)** and **Webster Patrick (Westfield)** both surpassed the 100-yard rushing mark last week against Abilene Christian.

Patrick ran for a career-high 103 yards on 17 carries and scored a touchdown against Abilene Christian. He averaged 6.1 yards per carry and scored on a 32-yard run on the Javelina's first possession of the third quarter.

The 103 yards was nearly as many yards as Patrick had run for all season (174) prior to the ACU game.

In his last two games, Patrick has carried the ball 29 times for 148 yards for an average of 5.1 yards per carry.

Miller registered his second 100-yard rushing game of the season and the sixth of his career as he ran for 105 yards on 20 carries and scored on an 11-yard run in the first quarter.

Fans can call TeamLine at 216-502-3200 and enter the passcode 7836 to listen to live broadcasts of Javelina football games on their cell phones. Since nearly every cell phone user has free weekend minutes, the only cost will be the \$5 charged for use of the service.

Now it doesn't matter where Javelina fans live, they can listen or watch their favorite college football team from any computer or cell phone.

All Javelina football broadcast can be heard live on KOPY-AM, 1070 in Alice, Texas, and KTAI-FM, 91.1 in Kingsville.

Miller also surpassed the 1,000-yard mark in all-purpose yards. He has 1,039 all-purpose yards this season.

It marked the first time since the 2002 NCAA Division II playoffs when quarterback Abel Gonzalez and running back Larry Williams each ran for 137 yards in the Javelinas' 27-20 win over Cal-Davis.

## Offense Kicks Into High Gear

The Javelina offense, after struggling in recent weeks, found its stride against #19 ACU.

Texas A&M-Kingsville set season highs for total offense (407), rushing yards (24), yards per rush (5.9), touchdown passes (3), points (38) and first downs (24).

The Javelinas ran for nearly as many yards against nationally ranked ACU (240) than they had in their previous three games combined (282).

The 407 yards of total offense is more than the previous two games against Midwestern State and Eastern New Mexico combined (378).

The three touchdown passes against ACU equaled the number of touchdown passes thrown in the previous four games combined.

The Javelinas also held on to the ball for 34:31, the largest time of possession of the season.

## Schlebach Continues Streaks

Freshman placekicker **Scott Schlebach (Arlington Seguin HS)** had some big shoes to fill, especially for a true freshman.

Senior placekicker Richard Hammond made 12 of 18 field goals last year, but Schlebach has done him one better, making 11 of 15 field goal attempts.

He is a perfect 9-of-9 inside 40 yards and has made all 26 of his extra point attempts.

Schlebach is the only kicker in the Lone Star Conference to make all of his extra point attempts and one of only three to make all of his field goals from inside 40 yards.

### **Taylor Continues To Be Dangerous**

If **Jareko Taylor (Detroit, Mich.)** gets his hands on the ball, chances are, he's in the end zone.

Taylor caught a pair of touchdown passes against Abilene Christian and now has seven touchdown receptions in eight games.

He leads the Javelinas with 49 catches in eight games, an average of just over six per game, has 646 yards and is averaging 13.2 yards per reception.

In his last two games, Taylor has caught 16 passes for 160 yards and three touchdowns.

Taylor also leads the Lone Star Conference in pass receptions per game and is third in touchdown receptions, despite playing just eight games.

### **Heatley Does It Bit By Bit**

Freshman quarterback **Jeremy Heatley (Breckenridge HS)** threw a career-high three touchdown passes against #19 Abilene Christian last week.

Heatley completed 18 of 34 passes for 167 yards. His longest pass completion was just 20 yards, but he did throw scoring passes of 20, 12, and 6 yards.

Heatley has thrown at least one touchdown pass in eight of ten games including four in a row. He now has 1,560 yards pass with 11 touchdowns and 1,638 yards of

total offense and has accounted for 14 touchdowns.

### **Yaden Reaches Paydirt**

Senior wide receiver **Steve Yaden (Riverside, Calif.)** finally tasted paydirt in week 10, catching a 12-yard scoring pass from Jeremy Heatley in the third quarter of last week's game against #19 ACU.

Yaden caught five passes for 46 yards, extending his pass catching streak to 20 games. He has caught at least one pass in every game he has played in after transferring to Texas A&M-Kingsville from Golden West College.

In two seasons, Yaden, an all-LSC catcher for the Javelina baseball team, has caught 83 passes for 903 yards and three touchdowns.

### **Javelina Offense Still Tough In The Red Zone**

Texas A&M-Kingsville is still number one in the Lone Star Conference in red zone offense. Last week the Javelinas were a perfect 6-for-6 inside the red zone last week and are now 23 for 25 on the year, an incredible 92 percent.

The Javelinas have converted 18 consecutive possession inside the opponent's 20-yard line. The last time the Javelinas did not convert was back against Western Oregon on September 16th.

### **Javelinas Continue Last Minute Magic**

Although they didn't win the game, the Javelina offense did drive 65 yards in five plays with not timeouts and tied the game at 38 with 1:03 left to play.

Quarterback Jeremy Heatley accounted for 59 of the drive's 65 yards, running once for 17 yards

### **Javelina Head Coach**

Richard Cundiff is in his seventh and final season as head coach at Texas A&M-Kingsville.

Cundiff announced that he will reign at the end of the season.

Cundiff has been on the Javelina staff since 1986 when he joined Ron Harms' staff as defensive coordinator.

Since that 1986 season, the Javelinas have posted a 184-72 record (.718).

In his seven years as head coach, the Javelinas have posted a 52-27 mark (.658).

During Cundiff's 21 years on staff, the Javelinas have won 12 LSC titles and made 13 NCAA Playoff appearances.

As head coach, the Javelinas have won four league titles and made four playoff appearances.

and completing 3 of 4 passes for 42 yards and a touchdown.

It's not the first time the Javelinas have put together last minute offensive heroics.

The Javelinas converted all three possessions in overtime in beating East Central, Heatley through a touchdown pass with 22 seconds to beat Southeastern Oklahoma and the Javelinas on their only possession of overtime to beat Texas A&M-Commerce.

Blackwater Draw, N.M. – Eastern New Mexico quarterback Michael Benton ran for two touchdowns, threw a touchdown and caught a touchdown pass to lead the Greyhounds past the Texas A&M-Kingsville 37-14 at Greyhound Stadium.

Eastern New Mexico had 435 yards of total offense, 318 of those yards on the ground. The Javelinas had 223 total yards.

Javelina quarterback Jeremy Heatley was 12 of 33 for 122 yards and a score, wide receiver Jareko Taylor caught seven passes for 80 yards, and Webster Patrick had 45 yards rushing on 12 carries.

The Javelinas got a trio of breaks to extend drives in the second half, but could only take advantage of one of them.

Eastern New Mexico was penalized on consecutive possession as the Javelinas were punting on fourth down. Each penalty gave Texas A&M-Kingsville a first down and a second chance. Eastern was also called for roughing the passer Heatley threw an incomplection on third down.

The one time the Javelinas converted a Greyhound miscue into points, Heatley completed a 44-yard touchdown pass to Taylor with 4:59 left in the third quarter to cut the Greyhound lead to 17-14. It was Taylor's fifth touchdown catch in seven games this season.
